

## **Lesson Plan Template**

Below is a sample lesson plan for teachers to use to teach their students about safe and active transportation and being idle-free in and outside the classroom.

Section of Template	Description
<b>Activity Name</b>	Idle-Free Encouragement Cards.
Grade	Grades 5-8.
Time	30-40 minutes (10-15 minutes in classroom + 20-25 minutes outdoors).
Summary	This activity teaches students about the effects of vehicle idling on air quality, health, and the environment. After a brief classroom lesson using the Idle-Free slideshow, students go outside with teacher supervision to hand out Idle-Free Encouragement Cards to drivers idling near the school. The cards serve as friendly reminders to turn off engines and reduce pollution.

Learning Goals	<ul> <li>Define "idling" and understand its environmental and health impacts.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Recognize how small individual actions contribute to reducing pollution.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Practice respectful, positive communication with community members.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Participate safely in a school-based environmental action project.</li> </ul>
Materials Needed	Idle-Free PowerPoint presentation.  Idle Free Free PowerPoint presentation.
	<ul> <li>Idle-Free Encouragement cards (printed double sided and cut out, 2-4 for each student).</li> </ul>



	Teacher/adult supervision outdoors.

Instructions for Activity	Before class, print and cut cards and prepare PowerPoint presentation.  Payious the safety guidelines and determine the "cafe."
	<ul> <li>Review the safety guidelines and determine the "safe area" around the school.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Note: The PowerPoint will include knowledge checks and fun facts to bring about discussion and participation.</li> </ul>

Setting the Stage	Begin with a discussion about air pollution and idling:
	Ask students: "Why do some people leave their engines running?" and "How could turning off a car engine make a difference?"
Introduction of Activity	<ul> <li>Explain that students will become "Idle-Free Ambassadors" for the day, spreading awareness through friendly, positive action that helps protect clean air around the school by handing out Idle-Free Encouragement Cards to parents and guardians outside the school.</li> <li>Explain that they will be taking on the role of educating those in their communities about the harms of idling.</li> <li>Discuss how positive messaging can be more effective than blame when inspiring change.</li> </ul>
Core Activity	<ol> <li>Students hand out Idle-Free Encouragement Cards to drivers idling outside the school.</li> <li>Present the slideshow presentation, explaining its impacts on health and environment, safety expectations, and how to interact with drivers (10 minutes).</li> <li>Practice sample dialogue with partners (5 minutes).</li> <li>Around dismissal time (3:00-3:30 PM, students will go outside and form partners or small groups with each other.</li> </ol>



	<ol> <li>With a supervisor watching, students will observe idling cars and approach cars on the curb closest to the school.</li> <li>Hand out cards to the idling drivers and non-idling drivers (20-25 minutes).</li> <li>Discuss the next day about how many cards were handed out, and driver's reactions.</li> </ol>
	Safety:
	<ul> <li>Stay on the sidewalk or clearly marked safe areas.</li> <li>Work in pairs or small groups with a supervisor present.</li> <li>Only approach fully stopped vehicles on the curb closest to the school.</li> <li>Keep a friendly, positive attitude and step back immediately if a car moves.</li> <li>Do NOT step onto the road or between cars.</li> <li>Do NOT argue with drivers or touch vehicles.</li> <li>DO NOT hand cards to moving cars or block traffic.</li> <li>Do NOT cross the road.</li> </ul>
Reflection and Discussion	<ul> <li>The next day, facilitate a short reflection,</li> <li>"How many cards did you hand out?"</li> <li>"What surprised you about how people reacted?"</li> <li>"What are other small actions that could help our school be more environmentally friendly?"</li> <li>"How did it feel to make a difference in your community?"</li> </ul>
Tips for Success	<ul> <li>Review safety rules carefully.</li> <li>Encourage positivity and confidence.</li> <li>Focus on appreciation, not blame.</li> </ul>
